The Common Bladderwort, *Utricularia vulgaris*, is a carnivorous plant living in water. Under water it has small snares that snap shut with lightning speed to catch water creatures. The flowers of this water plant are of an intense yellow colour. The *Utricularia vulgaris* can best be cultivated outdoors in a pond or a cistern.

Large bladderwort is an easy-care, carnivorous plant with beautiful green, thread-like leaves. Unrestrained the plant floats on the water without growing any roots. Whereupon the lid of the snare snaps shut and the animal is trapped and digested. In Holland Large bladderwort is an indigenous plant as in all the temperate zones of Europe. Arafloora has many different types of bladderwort for sale. The Large bladderwort does well in either pond or aquarium. The *Utricularia vulgaris* thrives in a lot of light and makes few demands on the temperature of the water. The natural outer temperature in Holland as well as the temperature indoors is imminently suited to the cultivation of this small plant. The *Utricularia vulgaris* also makes no high demands on the quality of the water it lives in; that may be neutral to slightly alkaline and should not be rich in nutrients. This Arafloora plant is for decoration only and not for consumption.
