The *Drosera burmannii* is a carnivorous plant from the sundew family. It's recognised by its triangular trap leaves and its long snap tentacles. This 'catapults' the prey into the trap leaf. *Drosera burmannii* can be kept on a windowsill or in a terrarium.

## Plantcare

The *Drosera burmannii* grows best in a standard peat-perlite mix. This *Drosera* is tropical and therefore requires high humidity. It is an annual plant, and dies after flowering and seed production. If desired, new plants can be grown again from the seeds.
